### Pastor Peter's Perspective

#### "Identity and Belonging"



"Know that the Lord is God. It is He who made us, and we are His; we are His people, the sheep of His pasture," Psalm 100:3.

In junior high, I struggled to find a group of friends to belong to. I bounced around from friend group to friend group. I joined the golf team, track team, cross country team, jazz band, and concert band. Those years are tough enough for a teenager, and I just couldn't find a place to belong... I didn't know how to identify myself... a golfer? A runner? A musician? Something else? It was a struggle.

Do you ever struggle with identity or belonging? When we don't know how to define ourselves, it can be easy to let the world and the culture around us define us. We can get caught up in how others might perceive us. We worry about letting others see the "real me." We get lost in a whirlwind of labels, fears, and anxieties. When we struggle with our own identity and a sense of belonging, our lives are typically defined by problems and worries.

Read Psalm 100:3 again at the top of this page. Our amazing God has not left you stuck in the place of problems and worries. He has not left you to wander through life in search of identity and belonging. Rather, He has rescued you from all fears and worries. He has given you a forever identity as His child. And He daily pursues you with His incredible love and grace.

Your identity above all else is a child of the living God. "It is He who made us, and we are His." Doesn't that take your breath away?! It should. The God who created the universe also created you... and cares deeply about you! He loves you like no other. And out of this love, He sent His Son to bring you back to Himself. The search is over for an identity and belonging. You and I belong to God. Period. My struggle in junior high ended when God led me on my first mission trip and I joined the youth group. I had a place to belong.

"We are His people, the sheep of His pasture." We have a place to belong. In Baptism, we are united with Jesus and His Body: the Church. It is here in this community of fellow sheep that we are reminded of our identity as God's people... and you and I belong here. It is here where we are forgiven and forgive; where we receive God's grace again and again; and where we connect, grow, and serve alongside each other. Belonging is not a solitary journey, it is a communal experience where we find support, encouragement, and love from fellow believers. Our belonging transcends boundaries of race, ethnicity, and social status. In Galatians 3:28, the Apostle Paul emphasizes, "There is neither Jew nor Gentile, slave nor free, male nor female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus."

So Faith, keep inviting your loved ones, neighbors, coworkers, coaches, teachers, supervisors, therapists, contractors, babysitters, cashiers, and everyone you meet to this community of belonging. Come as you are and discover and be reminded of your identity in Jesus Christ. Welcome to Faith, there's a place for you here!

### Stewardship Message from the Faith Leadership Board

#### STEWARDSHIP MESSAGE FROM THE FAITH LEADERSHIP BOARD

We give thanks for the blessed support that our congregation continues to provide for the ministries that are so important to us and the community in which we serve. As we look to "Connect, Grow & Serve" within and outside our church community, it is important to keep up on our financial support of the operating budget. Envelope giving for December exceeded budget by \$2,945 which helped to reduce the year-to-date shortfall to a total of \$31,074 less than budget and by \$15,880 vs. the same period last year.

We had over **160 households** participate in the Pavilion Capital Campaign whose generosity **helped us to meet our \$300,000 goal** for this ministry project. Our Finance Team has received some questions as to whether the Pavilion Capital Campaign impacted giving to Faith's general operating fund by our members. Our contribution data supports that the households that contributed to the Pavilion Capital Campaign have also provided year-to-date gifts to the general operating fund that are collectively above and beyond what they gave to Faith as of the same time last year. In addition, the pavilion project brought **30 new givers** to Faith! Look at what God can do!

We would like to extend a heartfelt thank you to the **106 households** who have already submitted their 2024 pledges totaling **\$390,439**. We will continue to accept 2024 pledges in the church office. You can submit your pledge by dropping it in the Concourse pledge box, mailing it to our church office (2576 Browncroft Blvd, Rochester, NY 14625) or calling the church office at 585-381-3970 with your pledge information.

We have also been very blessed to receive a robust response from many of our members indicating the ministries in which they have pledged to participate in the coming year. Exciting times are ahead of us as we embark on this new chapter of ministry together with Pastor Peter and our many ministry teams.

Paul reminds us in 1 Corinthians 4: 1 & 2, "This how is how one should regard us, as servants of Christ and stewards of the mysteries of God. Moreover, it is required of stewards that they be found faithful."



Now I see just how great my need, In His hands and in His feet. Lamb of God, oh, my soul shall sing, Hallelujah to the God who bleeds.

Over the years, I have become more drawn to the Lenten season and the beauty that lives there. I've never been one to give up chocolate, or a social media platform to take a fast symbolic to what

Jesus did for 40 days in the desert. Recently, I've been sitting in the ashes and seeing God's promises in the sorrows. So many years in a row I have seen folks struggle with unspeakable sadness, and experienced doses of my own. This is why for Lent of 2023 we took time with the Psalms of Lament. I feel strongly that these feelings need to be addressed, validated, and comforted in a worship setting. For 2024, we are using a book by Max Lucado entitled He Chose the Nails: What God Did to Win Your Heart, as the basis of our Wednesday Evening services and also for the Good Friday Tenebrae. Each chapter zooms in a specific detail or moment during Jesus' suffering during Holy Week. These moments tie across to the deep emotions we feel during our life here on earth. We will receive reminders that: Jesus understands our pain, we are not abandoned, God surrounds us, we are loved forever. I hope you will join us for these services, beginning with Ash Wednesday (Feb. 14) and be reminded of these promises. How appropriate that Lent begins on Valentine's Day – a day where we celebrate love – and we will have the opportunity to observe how much God loves us.

There is a new song that has been released by The Songwriter Initiative at the Center for Worship leadership at Concordia University Irvine. This initiative is an incredible effort that links songwriters and musicians across the nation with the goal to create a catalog of new music for the LCMS. I have been so pleased with what has been released so far, and this new song "God Who Bleeds" is the perfect lead up for Lent and reflection during the Easter season. I heard the debut of this song at the WALi Summit this past fall, and I find it so moving when a writer sings their own work and lays their heart on display. # HOW TO REDUCE TAXABLE INCOME WITH A QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTION



In an effort to help you be a good steward of the gifts God has given you, we would like to share a strategy that could be a blessing to you, your family, and our Faith family.

The generous standard deduction available for the current tax year is welcomed by many as it will simplify filing and could even reduce your tax bill. Even if you take the standard deduction, however, there is a tax-savvy strategy that allows retirees to further reduce their tax liability by taking advantage of qualified charitable distributions (QCDs) from their individual retirement accounts. This charitable rollover provision allows IRA owners 70 ½ years or older to transfer up to \$100,000 per year directly from their IRA to one or more qualified charities, without that donation being counted as taxable income when it is withdrawn. In addition, these qualified charitable distributions count as part of the person's required withdrawals from the IRA account.

Please consult your tax adviser and IRA trustee to make sure that you meet the qualifications to take advantage of this provision and that the distribution is properly processed.

If you would like to make a qualified charitable distribution to Faith Lutheran Church, please instruct your IRA trustee or custodian to make a transfer from the IRA directly to Faith Lutheran Church as the payee on the check. You may also have the distribution transferred directly from your IRA account to Faith Lutheran Church's checking account by contacting Kay Gerlach in the church office at 485-0412 or finance@faithpenfield.org for the necessary information. Your donation will be credited to support the unified budget of Faith Lutheran Church unless you designate otherwise via written communication to either Kay Gerlach, Director of Finance, or Kris Cronk, Church Secretary.

Please know that we sincerely appreciate any gift you make to support the ministry and mission of Faith Lutheran Church. We are so blessed that God provides so many ways for us to be a part of His work here on earth! May your gifts serve as a reminder that God provides all that you have and has given to us His greatest gift of all – His Son, Jesus who gave His very life for you!
