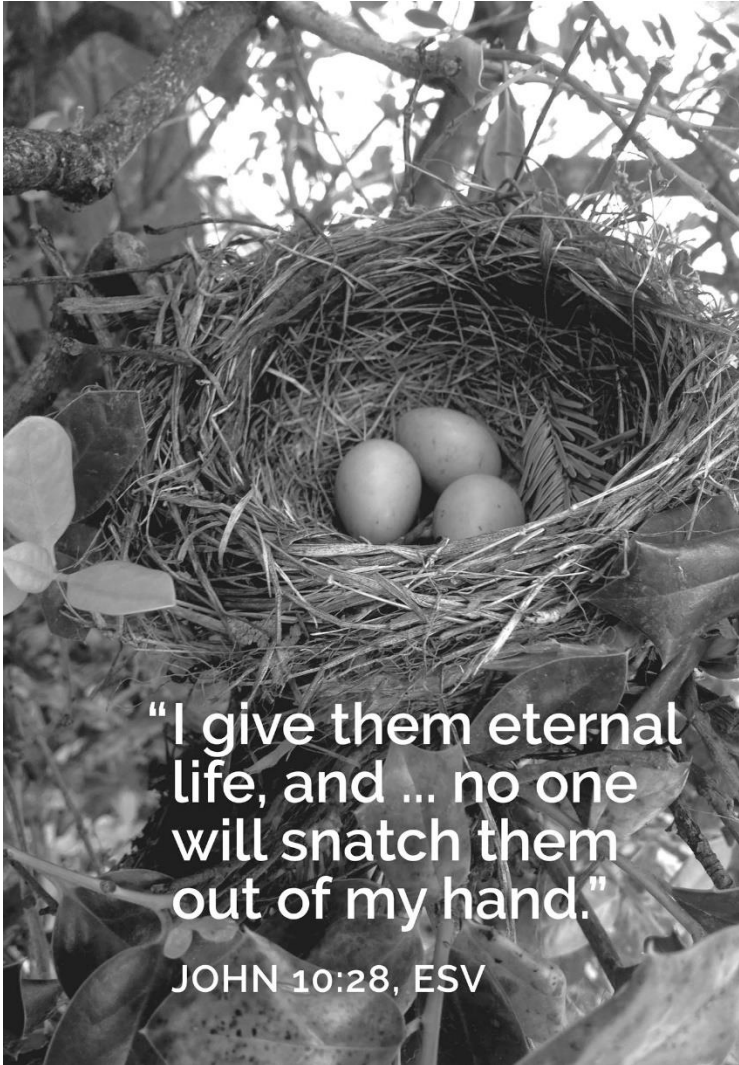

It features John Wykoff's new work "Out of This Darkness: A Normandy Cantata". Renowned lyricist Charles Anthony Silvestri penned the text, which captures Normandy's long and violent history while daring to ask for repentance and hoping for a more peaceful world. The

piece was composed in 2023, and premiered the same year in Caen, France by an American choir and French orchestra. It received its North American premier in 2024.

STEWARDSHIP MESSAGE FROM THE FAITH LEADERSHIP BOARD

The ongoing operations of Faith rely entirely on the generosity of the congregation to provide the funding support for the ministries that are so important to us and the community in which we serve.

We give thanks to God for your gifts to the general operating fund. We experienced a 23% unfavorable variance in envelope giving for the month of March resulting in a year-to-date unfavorable budget variance of \$18,177 or 9%.

2025 Update for Qualified Charitable Distributions

As many of you know, IRA owners age 70 1/2 and older can make tax-free charitable donations during the year through qualified charitable distributions (QCDs). The distribution remains tax-free if sent directly to a qualified charity by the IRA trustee. Starting in 2024, the QCD limit is subject to an annual adjustment, based on inflation. For that reason, the annual QCD limit has risen from the \$105,000 for 2024 to \$108,000 in 2025.
