Pastor Peter's Perspective



"Jesus called the crowd to Him and said, "Listen and understand," Matthew 15:10.

"Therefore consider carefully how you listen," Luke 8:18.

How well do you listen? It's a skill that my boys are learning... and frankly, their dad is still working on it too (just ask my wife). If we're honest, there have been times in our lives when we haven't listened as well as we should have. When we don't listen well to others, we might miss something important... like an opportunity to share the love of Christ.

Recently, I was listening to a podcast that featured a pastor I greatly respect: Rev. Dr. Dean Nadasdy, President Emeritus of the Minnesota South District of the LCMS. He was discussing the importance of "Gospel listening," which he defined as "listening with a heart for sharing the Gospel."

Pastor Nadasdy shared a helpful tool that I pray will assist each of us in sharing the Gospel of Jesus as we listen to and converse with others. It's not a "hidden agenda," but a framework that helps us listen for opportunities to share Christ's love. Pastor Nadasdy said, "Every person's needs can be summarized in three words: they're either bound, burdened, or broken. For each of those, there's a Gospel message."

A person who is **bound** is addicted to something, emotionally or spiritually entangled, and unable to escape the mess they're in. The Gospel message for them is one of freedom – of being set free. Jesus breaks the chains of the bound. "If the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed," John 8:36.

Someone who is **burdened** may be grieving, overworked, or carrying a load they can't release. The Gospel for the burdened is rest. Jesus carries loads we cannot bear alone. Jesus says, "Come to Me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest," Matthew 11:28.

If you're listening to someone who is **broken**, they may be shattered by betrayal, estranged from loved ones, and haunted by regret. They've lost their sense of wholeness. For the broken, Jesus brings peace – with God, themselves, and others. "He Himself is our peace," Ephesians 2:14.

As Christians, we listen not just with our ears, but with hearts tuned to share Jesus. The Gospel is for all people and all needs. When we listen well, we are better prepared to offer the Word that fits the moment – freedom, rest, or peace – in the name of Jesus. So whether over coffee, in a waiting room, or across the fence with a neighbor, let's listen with compassionate Gospel-tuned ears... and share Christ's Words.

And all God's children said, Amen!

This is my Father's world, And to my listening ears All nature sings, and round me rings The music of the spheres. This is my Father's world: I rest me in the thought Of rocks and trees, of skies and seas--His hand the wonders wrought.

Even though it feels like all this pollen is trying to kill me, spring is such a beautiful time. The magnolias, creeping phlox, tulips, and daffodils bloom triumphantly as the trees unfold their leaves. After the doldrums of winter, this is a blessed reprieve. In my devotional reading recently, I completed a re-read of Tish Harrison Warren's Liturgy of the Ordinary: Sacred Practices in Everyday Life. (As you may recall she was the author of the book that inspired our Lenten worship Prayer in the Night.) There is a thread between these two books and also other reading that has bolstered my "Sabbath Soapbox," the summation being: 1) We need *regular* Sabbath rest, it is how God designed us. 2) Sabbath is literally one of the 10 Commandments, follow it! 3) American hustle culture is of Satan's design, making us "too busy and distracted" to pray, worship, and rest in God's provision for our lives.

In the creation account in Genesis, we see the following phrase over and over: "And there was evening and there was morning, the X day." In Judaism, their Sabbath begins at sunset, and ends at the following sunset. Their observation of the coming day begins as the sun is setting. I find beautiful spiritual significance in this observation. Instead of the start of my day being when the alarm clock goes off, or when my child, or the cat wakes me up – the start of my day is in the rest of the evening and surrendering to God in sleep. Warren writes in <u>Prayer in the Night</u>, "For the Christian, sleep is an embodied way to confess our trust that the work of God does not depend on us....Sleep reminds us of our helplessness. Asleep we have nothing to commend us; we accomplish nothing to put on our résumé. Because of this, sleep is a counter-formative practice that reminds us that our assurance is not the sum of our productivity, prowess, or power." Warren also writes in <u>Liturgy of the Ordinary</u>, "My willingness to sacrifice much-needed rest and my prioritizing amusement or work over the basic needs of my body and the people around me reveal that these good things have taken a place of ascendancy in my life....repentance for idolatry may look as pedestrian as shutting off my email an hour earlier or resisting that alluring clickbait to go to bed."

Idolatry in general American society is not as blatantly obvious as the biblical accounts. When was the last time you saw loads of people throwing their gold jewelry into the fire to create a golden calf? However, anything that comes between us and our relationship with God is a form of idolatry. Our calendars, life's hustle and bustle, doom scrolling social media, online shopping for things we don't need for a hit of dopamine – these are all things that can get in the way of our worship life and the rest we require. Our first and foremost relationship to cultivate is with our God. Taking time for prayer, scripture, and worship are all ways to do this. Something I did recently to further increase scripture visibility in my daily life was to download a Bible App that will give a push notification of a verse of the day. So every day at the time of my choosing, 10:30am, I am sent a different verse that I get to read each day. It's a difficult balance living as a Christian in America's hustle culture, in some ways the practitioners of Orthodox Judaism have it easier! In that, their community and culture are based on these Sabbath habits, and by all of them taking it seriously together, it bolsters the ways to carry it out together, and reduces the temptation to act otherwise.

As we come to the end of the school year and move into summer, I'm hoping that you will carve out space to just be. Silence, Scripture, and Scenery can be a beautiful, healing combination. We live in a world beautifully designed and held together by our heavenly Father. He also designed you. Trust the creator of the universe to empower your rest and restoration, you deserve it!



The First Day of Summer Session is June 30th.


